Biographical or Historical Note

The Roswell Beautification Project was originally proposed by a University of Georgia study on Roswell Urban Improvement. Using the study as a starting point, a club composed of representatives from prominent Roswell organizations was formed to conduct landscaping projects. Represented organizations include local PTAs, the Woman's Club, the VFW, the Jaycettes, the Lion's Club, and several others. The committee representatives reported to City Hall for allocations and then enacted projects through their own club. The project also contacted local businesses to urge better landscaping.

The collection contains club minutes, a list of participating organizations, correspondence, and a newspaper article.
