Biographical or Historical Note

During the Civil War, the Roswell Mill manufactured supplies for the Confederate States of America. The Union army invaded Roswell in July 1864. Union General Sherman sanctioned the destruction of the mills and ordered the more than 400 mill workers, mostly women, to be charged with treason and sent to the North as prisoners. In 2000, the Roswell Mills Camp #1547 Sons of Confederate Veterans erected a monument in Sloan Street Park to commemorate the arrest and removal of Roswell mill workers.
