Biographical or Historical Note

Holly Hill was built between 1845 and 1847 for a prominent Savannah businessman named Robert Adams Lewis (1813-1906). The home was known as the Lewis House until 1950. In January of 1854, Robert Adams Lewis sold the house and its surrounding property to James Roswell King, the son of Barrington King. In 1902, James Roswell King's children sold the house to George Washington Wing, whose family retained ownership of the home until 1950. In August of 1950, Evelyn Hannah Sommerville and her husband Robert Sommerville purchased the home and named it Holly Hill.

Scope and Content

This box contains two deeds for Holly Hill. The 1854 deed transfers ownership of the Holly Hill house and property from Robert Adams Lewis to James Roswell King. The

1902 deed transfers ownership from the family of James Roswell King to George Washington Wing.
