Biographical or Historical Note

Caroline M. Dillman (b. 1927) is a native of Roswell, Georgia. She received her Ph.D. from Stanford University. Dr. Dillman was an assistant professor of sociology at Agnes Scott College in 1978. She was a member of the faculty at Reinhardt University in Waleska, Georgia during the 1980s. She wrote and edited many books about the Alpharetta-Roswell area. She also authored sections of the online New Encyclopedia of Georgia pertaining to the Roswell area.

Scope and Content

This collection contains research and resultant manuscripts by Caroline M. Dillman. Her research papers encompass photocopies of papers concerning the families, residencies, and businesses of Roswell, Alpharetta, and Milton, Ga. Among the manuscripts are master copies of *Days Gone By in Alpharetta and Roswell Georgia, Vol. I* and *Days Gone By in Alpharetta and Roswell Georgia, Vol. II*, as well as copies of *The Roswell*

Mills and A Civil War Tragedy. Other manuscripts in the collection include *Alpharetta Homes and Gardens* and *Garden Talk 1930s*, which were edited by Caroline M. Dillman. Also included are the metal covers plates for *Days Gone By in Alpharetta and Roswell Georgia, Vol. I & II*, negatives from *Days Gone By in Alpharetta and Roswell Georgia*, and the photographic plates from her various works.
