

## **Biographical or Historical Note**

James Lister Skinner III was a professor of English at Presbyterian College. Skinner inherited the local historic home Smith Plantation in 1981, prompting his research using the Smith family letters. The Smiths are relatives of James Lister Skinner III through his mother's aunt. During early 1980s, the Skinners worked with the City of Roswell to sell tracts of Smith plantation for city use.

The collection holds information on Smith family property and buildings. There are also papers on family gravesites and the final resident of the Smith Plantation, Mamie Cotton.
