Biographical or Historical Note

Lebanon Baptist Church was first organized in the present-day Roswell area. Amariah Hembree, his family, and thirteen other believers met in the Hembree home on 16 July 1836 with the purpose of organizing a missionary Baptist church. Some of the church's early members included Dorothy Felton, whose daughter-in-law became the first woman elected to the U.S. Senate, and a slave named Jone, who worked in the home of John Bulloch, the grandfather of former president Theodore Roosevelt, Jr. In 1838, Lebanon raised money for its first church edifice, which was erected on Houze Road. The church relocated to the corner of Holcomb Bridge and Alpharetta Highway and, later, moved to a new building on Crabapple Road in 1974, where the church remains today.
