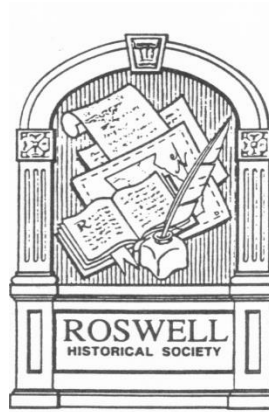

**Biographical or Historical Note**

The City of Roswell was founded as a large mill complex between Vickery Creek and the Chattahoochee River. The mill complex on Mill Street was built in 1882 and operated as a cotton mill. In 1923, the mill was sold to William G. Broadfoot of Wilmington, North Carolina and operated under a new charter and a new name, Roswell Mills, Inc. In 1947, Southern Mills, Inc. took over the operation of the mill. Southern Mills ended its operation in 1975 and the mill closed. In 1985, the Roswell Mills building on Mill Street was renovated and reopened as an events facility.

**Scope and Content**

This collection contains a scrapbook with photographs and proposed plans for renovating the Mill complex. It also contains a list of employees of Roswell Mills, Inc. from circa 1930, which was tucked inside the scrapbook.
